<b>Call to Order</b>	Chair, Raymond Kemp, called meeting to order at 12:03 p.m.
<b>Approval of Feb. 11, 2021 Minutes</b>	Approval of Feb. 11, 2021, minutes moved and seconded. No corrections. No abstentions.
<b>Presentation – 211 Sacramento</b> Gabriel Kendall Katherine Sorensen	Representatives from 211 Sacramento described services and information available via 211. Services include family court assistance, CalFresh application assistance, income support/assistance, legal assistance, and information on housing, health care, food, taxes. Services are available in five different languages; 200+ languages with connection to interpretation service.
<b>Discussion – Alternative 911 Response Plan Update</b> Jim Hunt, Director, Health Services	In response to a request from the Board of Supervisors to revisit the alternate 911 response plan, DHS is reviewing many aspects of the plan. Options include three different plan timeframes: 8, 16, and 24 hours/day. DHS is working with a consulting firm at no cost to Sacramento County on the plan. <b>Discussion – Recommendations from HSCC members re: <i>Street Sheet</i></b>	The Street Sheet is produced by Francis House and is used by DHA and other agencies to provide information to clients. The group discussed dated information on the Street Sheet and how it can be updated more frequently.  211 Sacramento may be able to assist with maintaining current information via a weekly export.  The Chair recommended a review of the Street Sheet to be sent to DHA for staff review/update, followed by coordination with 211 Sacramento.
<b>Member Comments</b>	First 5 discussed its resolution on racial equity, which maintains that racism, not race, contributes to health care disparities.  The Children’s Coalition discussed plans for the new Children’s Report Card coming in July.
