	Lisa Culp explained that now homeless beds go through a centralized process, which takes out the relationship.	



	Commissioner Campbell asked if the Office of Data Innovation has been contacted to see if data can be collected from them. Shannon used population data which is what is happening at an agency and therefore conclusions can be made but it does not tell the story of the community, just the people being serviced by the agency. Looking for people to lead the partnership with this data project. Let Coordinator Hernandez know if you would like to be the lead. It will need to be 2 leads with at least one Commissioner.
