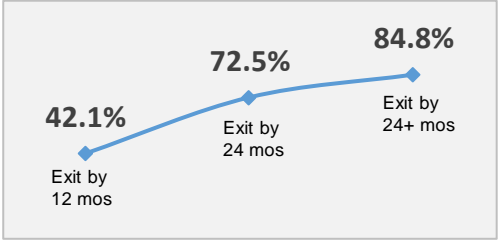

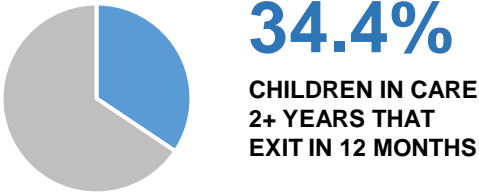
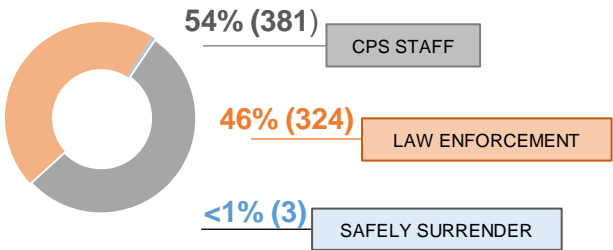


EXITS FROM CARE TO PERMANENCY

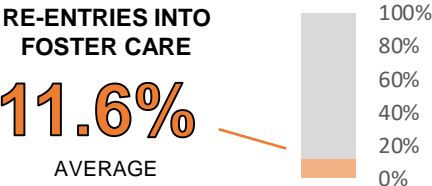
