CDSS is decertifying all out of state group homes, which means there will be a complicating factor for placements moving forward. <p>Review of P3 Work</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review of history of P3 outcome area –Permanency in 12 months for children in foster care 24 months or more. All P3 action steps were completed with the primary strategy being intensive family finding. For 3 consecutive years, we have met or exceeded the State and national goals due to the work completed internally and with partners. Some of the action steps included: hiring a concurrent planning social worker, data pulling, case reviews, use of Destination Family <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Leon Burse shared the work that he has done as a concurrent planning social worker. Margo shared 3 stories of permanency successes. Will continue to keep this on the radar moving forward. ○ Create and distribute a survey for families and youth to hear their voice. <p>We are at the end of this SIP cycle (ending officially in May 2021). Our County assessment of our next identified outcome areas, will be completed by the end of 2021 and submitted to the County Board of Supervisors for approval then the next 5yr SIP work will begin in May 2022.</p>	
<p>Review of data</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Highlighted that over the progress of the SIP years, we have consistently met and exceeded our goals. ● Highlighted that due to COVID and courts not being functional, there was impacts to the outcomes leading to a decrease in meeting the standard. ● Child Counts are included to show what is achievable. ● Review of analysis of the COVID impacts such as Courts closing in March and not reopening for months. The drill down of data was to identify when the impact occurred and how it is in alignment with the P3 data. Data verifies the dip in outcomes due to Court operations ceasing due to COVID ● Discussion re: the disruption and change in system structure to pivot during COVID. Including lack of visitation, virtual meetings, court issues, inability to transition a family out of the system (due to no court) in addition to new families added to staff caseloads, increase of angst and workloads with staff. Staff and partners have been phenomenal.

<p>Identify Partner Needs During COVID</p> <p>Probation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Family finding on the front end during the court process, has been successful for RFA recruitment. CFTs at intake, also helps identify family members that can go through RFA process. When there are no identified family members who either can or are willing to step up and go through the RFA process, staff has talked with youth to identify NREFM. Utilizing second chance reunifications. Shared detailed data in regards to current youth (13) that meet the P3 data. <p>Stanford/Sierra Youth Solutions: Continue to meet with units and supervisors. Heather shared that they are currently serving 60 youth and have availability to take more referrals.</p>	
<p>End of Cycle Next Steps</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Given that we completed all action steps but there were things that we didn't get to (resource faire, surveys) it was suggested that we meet two more times. February – case study, data review and discuss a way to complete the last tasks. April meeting to conclude the SIP cycle and speak to next steps going 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tiffany to schedule February meeting. Stephanie will facilitate inviting Americorp volunteers to the next two meetings.
