Check-In (All) (10 – 20 minutes)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The workgroup reported the COVID impact to their agencies • Agencies are following safety protocols, implementing visitation procedures, virtual meetings and social distancing while continuing to meet the needs of youth and families during the COVID pandemic <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - CPS: Jalu: The agency continues to operate during COVID In alignment with the State directives, in-person meetings with families and partners converted to virtual; new guidance received from the state re: resuming in-person contacts (ACL 20-70 released on 6/17/20) – will distribute a copy to the workgroup; division wide: CPS staff have been teleworking with the exception of certain staff who continue to report to the office Arobia: Court hearings are being conducted via Zoom meetings; Clerical, Child Development Specialist and Paralegals will return to the office on Monday Stephanie: Hotline calls decreased by 50% overall; the Hotline team continues to modify and make changes as needed

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	<p>Melanie: The Workforce Development Unit has been busy converting all in-person training to a virtual platform Lisa, Mia, Kevin, and Maysua (Program Administration): Continue to provide support across Programs with all duties in place; adjusting to teleworking</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Wind Youth Services: Peter: The Wind Youth Center remains open during COVID and is limited to youth who are experiencing true homelessness. The Center has been successful in collaborating with the Bridge Program to meet youth needs. - Sacramento Children’s Home (SCH) STRTP: Annette: The SCH campus is closed; meetings between youth and family/foster parents have been conducted via Zoom.
