Call to Order	Chair, Raymond Kemp, called meeting to order at 12:04 p.m.
Approval of Mar. 11, 2021 Minutes	Approval of Mar. 11, 2021, minutes moved and seconded. No corrections. No abstentions.
Update on Sacramento County COVID-19 cases, vaccine availability and locations Dr. Olivia Kasirye Public Health	There have been a total of 99,000 COVID-19 cases and more than 1,600 deaths reported in Sacramento County. Average reported cases per week: 120-150.
	If hospitalizations remain low and vaccines remain available to all Californians, the statewide Blueprint for a Safer Economy tiered system will stop on June 15. If the Blueprint discontinues, the Sacramento County Health Officer order regarding COVID-19 safety measures will discontinue as well. Sacramento County Public Health will continue to provide other guidance like continuing to wear face coverings.

211 Sacramento Street Sheet Update: QR code for <i>Street Sheet</i>	HSCC is in discussion with Goodwill re: using QR code to access Street Sheet. Continuing to update and confirm Street Sheet information.
Discussion: Challenges to Human Services	Using General Assistance has been a real challenge for people with disabilities. Cannot stand in line. Long wait or no live answer via phone. Same issue with connecting with doctors at Kaiser via phone; have to leave a message and be available for a return call. [HSCC has no influence with private companies.]
	General Assistance opened lobbies for in-person applications in January. But because of limits on numbers of people being indoors due to COVID-19 restrictions, it is still very busy. As of the last week of March, all offices are open.
	A public service announcement may be helpful to alert the public to the issues with GA access.
	Similar access issues with calling 211. Calls re: housing instability are going unanswered. Recording promises call back, but return call does not always happen. Concerning because 211 is supposed to be homeless/housing insecurity portal.
