Update: Crisis Wellness Response and Call Center (Alternative 911 Response Plan)	The County of Sacramento engaged community members to gather input on an emergency response for mental health and quality of life crises, including homelessness. COVID-19 Update: Sacramento County Move To Orange Tier	As of June 10, there have been 107,117 COVID-19 cases reported in Sacramento County and 1,716 total deaths. Average new cases: 58 per day.  Approximately 60% of Sacramento County residents have received 1 vaccination dose and 49% are fully vaccinated.  About 50 people per day are showing up at vaccination clinics; down from a high of about 1,000 per day.  Mask requirements: CDPH guidelines recommend wearing a mask indoors. For now, Sacramento County is using CalOSHA current guidelines which require masks indoors for businesses for staff and social distancing.  A mobile team is available to vaccinate homeless individuals and is in communication with shelters. The mobile team offers two options: Johnson and Johnson and Moderna. 1,615 vaccination doses have been provided to persons experiencing homelessness. According to Sac Steps Forward, there are approximately 5,000 total unsheltered people in Sacramento County.
