Identifying FY 2022-23 Budget Priorities	Council members reviewed input from the September 2, 2021, ad hoc meeting, proposed, discussed, and approved the following five budget priority areas for submission to the Sacramento County Executive's office. The members acknowledged and expressed thanks for this exceptional opportunity to provide input for the FY 2022-23 budget process.
	HOUSING – Affordable, accessible housing that is available to low and middle-income residents, including older adults, and people with disabilities. Flexible funding for older adults facing financial crises, which can lead to homelessness – payment of utility bills, rent, home repair.
	INCREASED CAPACITY FOR TREATMENT - Increase general health and human services availability including public and mental health services and human assistance; services for older adults, foster and low-income youth, and people with disabilities; and increased efforts to create health equity.
	PUBLIC SAFETY – Alternative solutions to 911 response for mental health crises. Alternatives to incarceration for behavioral health crises. Integration of human services into the 911 response. Accessibility of appropriate crisis response for people with disabilities. Increased residential capacity for men, co-occurring (MH and SUD), adults, and youth.
	HUNGER/FOOD INSECURITY – Food deserts; accessibility of services for people with disabilities
	WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT – Culturally competent and inclusive of all communities, including people with disabilities (reasonable accommodation).
