There is a new class called How to Prevent a 14-Day Notice Class at ARC. Survey could include close ended questions: call SW, looked at resource guide, contacted resources • Cynthia will revisit the SCOE guide to see if there are caregiver resources, Cathi will send out the existing draft of resource guide, and the SMART Pages to the group for team to review and start to figure out what resources will be included in the SMART pages. • Team will work on deciding what resources will be included |
| PC-CARE (Susan/Deanna) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FY 18/19 Q3 (4/1/19-6/30/19) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Susan went over PC-CARE report: Q2 82 eligible referrals & Q3 50 eligible referrals • At 1-month follow up contacts 86.3% of children completing PC-CARE still lived in same resource home, compared to 37% of children who dropped out or never started program • At 6-month follow up contact 38% of PC-CARE completers were still in same resource home (6% adopted) compared to 31% who never started or dropped out of treatment (0% adopted) • *Q2: 17 (11%) not a placement change (only caregiver status change) & Q3: 5 (5.4%) not a placement change (only caregiver status change) |
